The Great Sioux Nation, known as Oceti Sakowin, or Seven Council Fires, is a confederation of closely allied cognate bands. They speak three mutually intelligible dialects of the Siouan language family: Dakota, Nakota, and Lakota. In the 1500s and 1600s AD, Sioux people were still living around the Great Lakes (modern Minnesota); that's where they were in 1667 when they first met.
